The MjPHC has several exciting events coming up in the next few months. The first is our Preparing for Success Clinic in April. It will take place from Friday, April 8<sup>th</sup> to Sunday, April 10<sup>th</sup> at Misty River Equestrian Center. We have Joe Frank Brown coming up from Texas to be our clinician. He owns and operates Joe Frank Brown Show Horses in Gladewater, Texas. He specializes in training Paint Horse Youth exhibitors in all disciplines of the horse show arena. He and his clients have earned numerous World and Reserve World Titles. He has trained youth who have been number two in the nation and many top five riders. On Friday at 7 PM we will have an advanced showmanship clinic for those exhibitors who already know the basics of showmanship and wish to fine tune their abilities. On Saturday we will begin at 8 AM with showmanship. At noon we will have a lunch break, and will commence at 1:30 with horsemanship and hunt seat equitation. Joe will also include rail work in this segment. The clinic is expected to end at 5:30. On Sunday Joe will be working on trail from 8 AM to noon. It is \$150.00 to participate in all sessions. Otherwise it is \$75.00 per session. For spectators ten and over it is ten dollars to audit for the weekend. Stalls are \$15.00 per night. Stalls will be available for early arrivals on Friday. The form for the clinic is located at [missouripainthorseclub.com](http://missouripainthorseclub.com) under the youth

club tab. Entry forms are due to Debby Neer by April 1. The form includes the address of Misty River and several close hotels.

Our next event after the clinic is our May show. It will be held on April 30 and May 1. It has two judges each day and will be held at the Boone County Fairgrounds in Columbia, Missouri. As of this year we have all six Amateur Walk Trot division classes! The youth club will have a bake sale Saturday morning with breakfast goodies and lots of sweets too. As last year, we will be sponsoring a canned food drive for the local shelter. Last year, these two events were very successful.

Our next show will be our Memorial Day Weekend show. It will be held at the Boone County Fairgrounds in Columbia, Missouri on May 28th, 29th and 30<sup>th</sup>. We will have two judges on the Saturday, May 28 and Monday, May 30 and on Sunday, May 29, there four judge Youth and Amateur Paint-O-Rama. The Classic and Masters Amateur Western Pleasure will be split during this show. The youth club will have a pattern book available for sale during this event as one of our fund raisers for the year.
